
- MCST is the National Contact Point Organisation for the European Framework Programme for R&I (Horizon Europe) in Malta:


MSCA Doctoral Networks (DN)

- Consortia (3 legal entities from different MS/AC)
- Duration: up to 4 years
- Each beneficiary recruits at least 1 doctoral candidate (3 to 36 months)
- Supervisors in each beneficiary and associated partner entity
- Size: up to 360 person-months, 180 additional person-months for joint or industrial doctorates
- Secondments up to 1/3 of the fellowship
- The call is now open! Docs and guides are available!
- Deadline: 15th November 2022
- Resubmission restrictions score below 80%

Industrial Doctorates

- Industrial Doctorates mandatory involvement of the nonacademic sector in the doctoral training so that the skills acquired better match public and private sector needs;
- Min. 50% of fellowship duration in a non academic entity
- No limitation of secondments

Joint Doctorates



- At least 3 entities must award Phd degrees (2 of which in a MS/AC)
- Mandatory Joint/double/multiple degree letter of pre-agreement
- No limitation in secondments

MSCA Staff Exchanges

- Consortia: min 3 independent legal entities from 3 different countries
- Staff: researchers at any career stage (doctoral to postdoctoral), as well as administrative, managerial and technical staff
- Size: 360 person months
- Duration: 48 months
- Secondments: 1 to 12 months
- No mobility rule
- Call deadline: March 2023
- Eur 2,300 per month per staff





Horizon Europe - €95.5 billion





- Widening participation seeks to address <u>discrepancies</u> in the take-up of Research and Innovation opportunities between different underrepresented groups of Member States.
- The European Research Area (ERA) is the ambition to create a single, borderless market for research, innovation and technology across the EU.

Teaming will support the creation of new centres of excellence or upgrading the existing ones in low R&I performing countries, building on partnerships between leading scientific institutions and partner institutions in low R&I performing countries

A Teaming project will be implemented as a Coordination and Support action (CSA) under Horizon Europe with grants of up to 15 million €

Stage 1: Initial concept of the CoE in line with the host region's smart specialisation strategy. Stage 2: financial support to start implementing the future centre

Twinning aims to enhance *networking activities between the research institutions* of the Widening countries and internationally-leading counterparts at EU level by linking it with at least two research institutions from two different Member States or Associated Countries.

Activities like short-term staff exchanges, expert visits, on-site or virtual trainings, workshops, conference attendance, dissemination and outreach are supported

a special focus on strengthening the research management and administrative skills of the coordination institution from the Widening country

Budget per project: 0.80M – 1.5M

Consortia must include at least two different place-based R&I ecosystems in at least two different countries eligible to host the co-ordinator under the widening part of Horizon Europe.

Quadruple helix approach

- academic institutions (universities and/or non-university research centers or labs),
- business entities (active established firms with relevant revenues),
- ✓ public authorities or authorised agencies and
- ✓ societal actors (civil society organisations, associations, citizens, end users, media, cultural actors etc.).

Aim: to strengthen regional innovation excellence in placed based innovation ecosystems by cross-border collaboration on a common strategy and/or alongside value adding chains

- Strengthening capacity for excellence in higher education institutions and surrounding ecosystems
- ✓ focus on capacity building for networks of higher education institutions and partners in the local ecosystem, with a view of preparing the networks towards the full roll-out of the European Universities initiative in the years to come
- Strengthen considerably the networks towards realising integrated cooperation between the participating entities in the research and innovation dimension, in synergy with the entities' education and training missions

~Entities who received funding under the European Universities initiative pilot may participate but are excluded from funding
